Food and Agricultural Security Sector:

- 1- Empowering communities to access their basic food needs.
- 2- Enhancing agricultural production and self-productivity.
- 3- Fortifying agricultural livelihoods.
- 4- Preserving natural resources and fostering sustainable agricultural production systems.
- 5- Strengthening communities' capacities in the field of food and agricultural security.



Nutrition Sector:

- 1- Strengthening the prevention of malnutrition and related diseases.
- 2- Providing food baskets to the most vulnerable HHs in the community.
- 3- Strengthening food crises response capabilities.
- 4- Improving the nutritional status of children under five, pregnant and lactating women.
- 5- Enhancing access to safe and diverse food sources.



Health Sector:

- 4- Ensuring access to essential services for people with disabilities.

- 1- Providing safe and dignified shelter for the affected people and most vulnerable HHs.
- 2- Ensuring access to essential Non-Food Items for the affected IDPs.
- 3- Enhancing the crisis response capabilities of local communities.

- 5- Supporting and promoting permanent housing solutions.



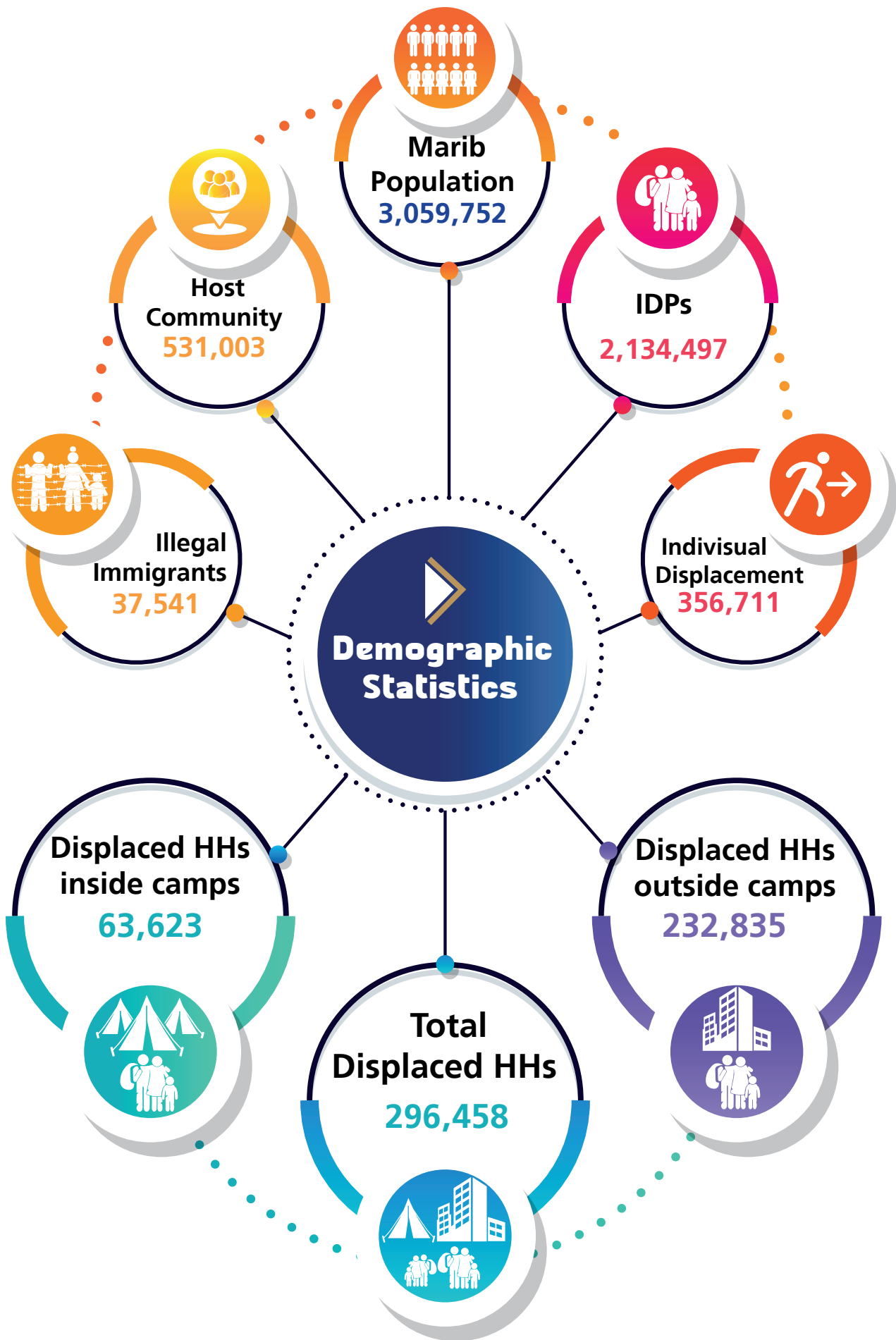
CCCM Sector:

- 5- Broadening collaborations with humanitarian stakeholders to bolster services within camps.

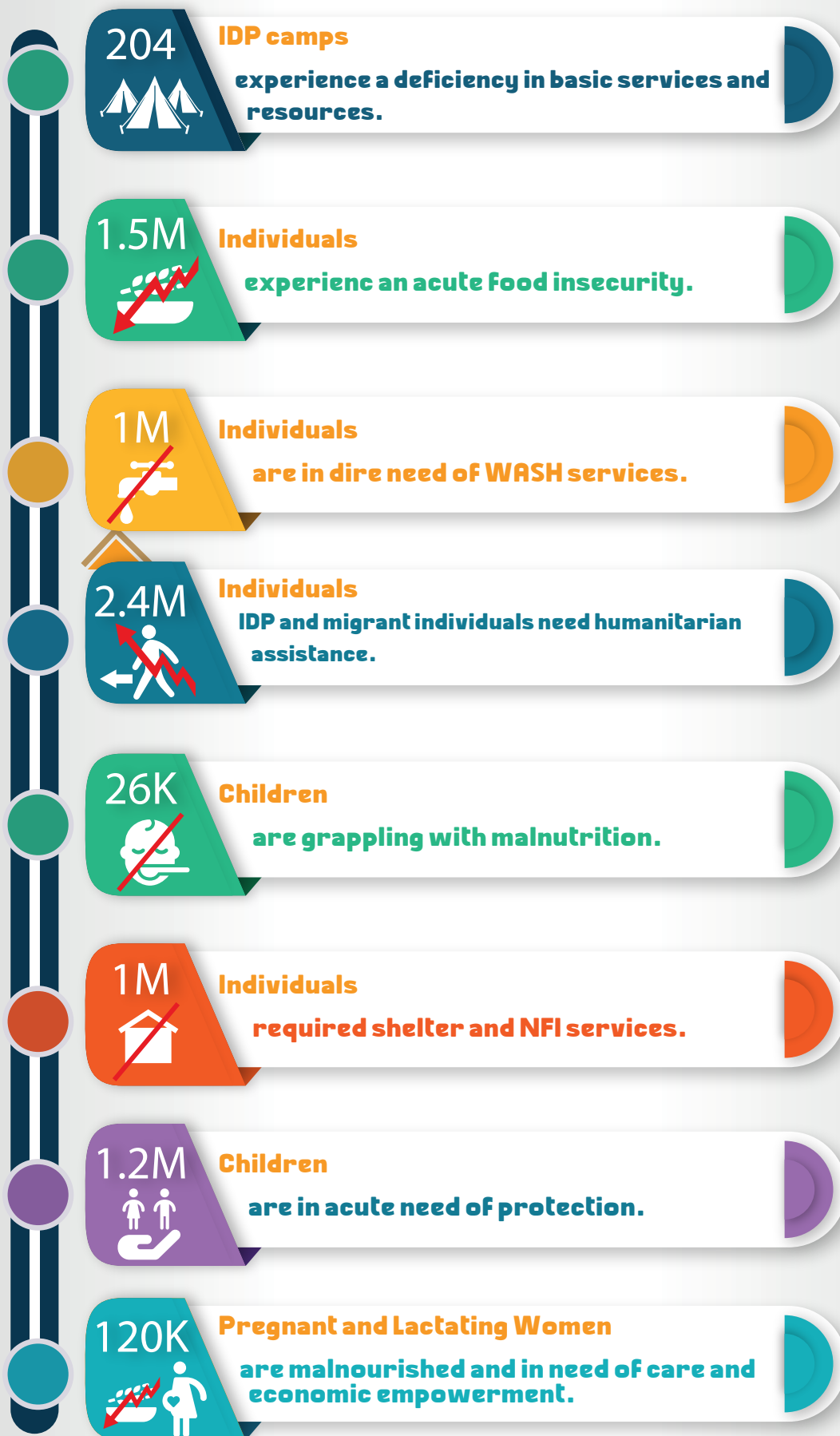


▶ Marib Profile

Marib, a Governorate in Yemen, stands as a captivating blend of ancient history, cultural diversity, and rich natural resources, positioning it as one of Yemen's most prominent governorates. It is situated to the northeast of capital Sana'a, approximately 173 kilometers away. Marib encompasses 14 districts; City District serves as its administrative center. The Governorate is bordered by Al-Jawf Governorate to the north, Shabwa and Al-Bayda to the south, Shabwa and Hadhramaut to the east, and Sana'a to the west. It spans an area of approximately 17,405 square kilometers distributed across the 14 districts. As of 2023, the population of the governorate reached 3,059,752. In recent years, Marib has endured the throes of armed conflicts, taking a heavy toll on the humanitarian landscape. Over the past nine years, the Governorate has opened its doors to over two million IDPs, providing a refuge for those uprooted by war and the brutality of Houthi militias. Therefore, Marib is currently populated with 8% of the total population of the country. Agriculture is the backbone of the Governorate's economy, holding the esteemed position of third among the Republic's governorates in terms of agricultural crop production, contributing (7.6%) of Yemen's total agricultural crop production, trailing Sana'a and Hodeidah governorates. Marib holds the distinction of being the first to strike oil, with production commencing in 1986. Among its significant tourist attractions are the awe-inspiring Marib Dam, Sun Temple, Bilqis Throne and the ancient ruins of Surwah.

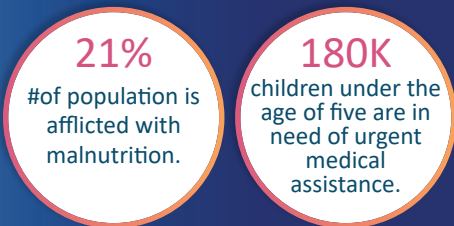


Humanitarian Landscape Overview :



The humanitarian crisis in Marib has reached its direst point in the nine years of the ongoing conflict. A disproportionate number of people face death, starvation, and diseases compared to any other governorate in the country. The suffering is unprecedented in scale. Hundreds of thousands are on the brink of starvation. Marib has been classified as phase 4 in the Integrated Phase Classification (IPC) System for 2024.

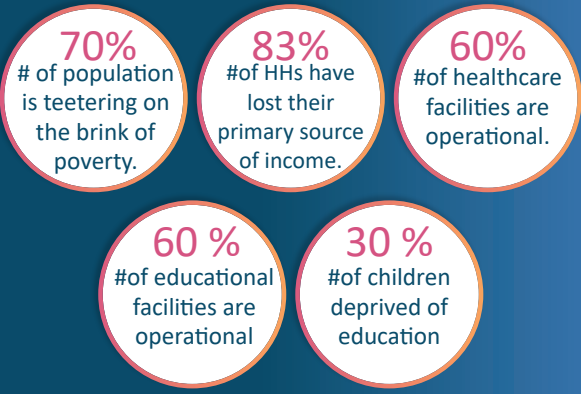
An alarming proportion of women and children, approximately one-third, are grappling with the harsh realities of malnutrition, with the majority facing severe cases. These severe malnutrition rates have surpassed World Health Organization's emergency threshold of 15%. Numerous public institutions that serve as lifelines are in urgent need of essential services, including electricity, WASH, transportation, social support, healthcare, and education. However, these institutions are crippled by financial constraints, budget cuts, and funding shortfalls. The situation is further exacerbated by the deteriorating state of water infrastructure, which operates at a mere 5% of its capacity.



Local Humanitarian Context

The war has precipitated the degradation of public services and the collapse of the economy in Marib, resulting in a significant deterioration in public services quality and infrastructure. Sharp escalations in school dropout rates are anticipated in the forthcoming years, while households (HHs) grapple with the repercussions of war. The economic collapse is most starkly evident in income loss, depreciation of the Yemeni Rial, price hikes, leaving millions of individuals unable to meet their basic needs.

The relentless war on Marib has had a catastrophic impact on civilians, resulting in either direct or indirect deaths of thousands, predominantly civilians, and leading to complications arising from lack of food, healthcare and infrastructure. The war has severely restricted civilians' freedom of movement, livelihoods and access to basic services and infrastructure due to armed shelling, targeting markets, schools and hospitals.



Plan Methodology:

The methodology employed in the preparation of HRP integrated research into information from both primary and secondary sources. Secondary sources encompassed studies, reports, and official plans, supplemented by consultation of humanitarian reports and plans issued by United Nations, as well as statistical data concerning the governorate, records, and information from governmental offices. Additionally, primary sources, including interviews and discussion sessions between stakeholders and local authority, to enrich the plan's findings gleaned from both primary and secondary sources. The following steps were undertaken:

1. A provincial-level Humanitarian Response Committee has been established to prepare and oversee the implementation of Marib's HRP (2024-2025), headed by Deputy Governor Dr. Abdo Rabbo Muftah. This was decreed by the Governor (Decree No. (62) of 2023), issued in December 24, 2023.
2. The Committee referred to the previous HRP 2023, and the tasks were sorted out for each office separately.
3. Establish data collection models and required information from government offices for HRP.
4. In accordance with the attached models and as outlined in sections (3 - 2), all government offices and districts are hereby instructed to submit their humanitarian and development needs.
5. Both offices and districts' list were first organized, then divided into groups, and monitoring teams were assigned to oversee the offices and districts, ensuring that the templates are delivered within a week from the date of issuance.
6. Extending an additional period for late submissions and maintaining communication and follow-up until all templates are collected.
7. Development of the framework and main themes of (HRP).
8. Since its formation, the Committee has held a series of meeting to follow up the Plan's implementation stages.
9. Evaluating and prioritizing urgent and development needs submitted by the government offices.
10. Technical, financial and corrective review of the identified projects by qualified specialists.
11. Approval of the final draft of the Plan.
12. Design and production of the Plan.
13. Final review of the Plan.
14. Printing and distribution of HRP to relevant stakeholders.

- Preparing periodic reports encompassing results and recommendations.
- Disseminating reports to relevant stakeholders.
- Harnessing evaluation outcomes to enhance the performance of response projects.
- Guaranteeing stakeholder engagement in the evaluation process.
